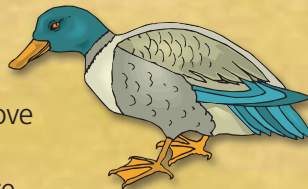
All of these animals can be found in the nature center. Some can be tricky, so keep your eyes peeled. When you find an item, write down what it looks like and where it is. Don't collect the item.
